Residents will have the opportunity to provide comments and suggestions on the update to the CCMP, which is expected to be completed in early 2015. The updated CCMP will provide guidance for the Long Island Sound Study and its partners, including New York, Connecticut, and the Environmental Protection Agency, in restoration efforts for the next 20 years.
