The Long Island Sound Study's #DontTrashLISound #ProtectOurWildlife campaign looks at preventing plastic waste in Long Island Sound by encouraging people to bring reusable bags and bottles to Long Island Sound beaches, parks, and Stewardship Areas!

The longfin squid, *Doryteuthis pealeii*, typically migrate into Long Island Sound in May to feed and spawn and then move back out to the warmer continental shelf waters in the late fall. Squid are in the mollusca phylum and are related to clams, oysters and other bivalves.
