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1:25pm	LISS Work Group - Work Plan Discussion Items #1 WW-14 Support collaborative and inclusive development of new and updated restoration/protection plans for Connecticut and New York embayment subwatersheds with pollution load reduction targets.  LISS should fund the development, identification, and appropriate maintenance of 9 Element Watershed Plans and other planning documents that will allow LISS to provide financial and other support for implementation activities over the longer-term.  Priority Areas for watershed planning will be collected from the states and provided to NFWF/LISFF for future funding focus areas. VT and NH have 5-yr priority plans in place, LISFF/NFWF could be a source of funding to support implementation.  #2 WW-13 Improve efficiency and resiliency of existing/new waste treatment systems including septic, WWTF and stormwater infrastructure to be resilient to sea level rise, storm surge, and intense storms and flooding.  The NCWG continues to support advancements relative to this IA to facilitate implementation of improvements to onsite wastewater treatment systems located in coastal areas of the LIS watershed  LISS should direct infrastructure funds to specific areas based on need and benefit.  The work group will communicate and encourage proposals for this implementation Action as they come up.  #3 WW-26 Improve the permitting and certification process for new aquaculture projects with products intended for human consumption, particularly those projects with a bioextraction focus.  A priority for the NCWG that deserves additional funding and status in the FFY 2024 LISS work plan and budget.  It is noted that this IA should be advanced by the LISS Bioextraction Coordinator, and the position be funded into the future.  It was suggested that we identify specific projects (where to focus) additional funds. What is the best way to go about this with the states? What can the Sea Grant programs tell us about this?
