2:35 PM USGS Compound Flood Risk Model updates – Kris Masterson & Liv Herdman (USGS)

- Kris shared they are documenting technical processes to define risks
- In order to release the mapper, all of the data needs to be released at the same time.
 - Sub-teams are getting everything ready to be made publically available with public articles.
 - Rainfall risk
 - Coastal Risk
 - Compound flood risk
 - ID-ing whether there is evidence of co-occurrence and the statistical significance of those correlations
 - Model archives depth to water and groundwater emergence risk
- Release by June (public)
 - Then will have a steering committee meeting around June
 - Considering a fact sheet to explain the mapper and how to use it.
